atives faced questions on the pre-conditions and the timing of its responses on several accounts. "What is the rationale behind selecting these 33 hospitals? What is the density exercise that you have conducted? Is it a random selection? What is the density exposure and how many of the hospitals have been reserved in the Central district of the city with the fourth sero survey report showing increase in the cases? How have the beds been divided," the judges asked.

Responding to these, the ASG said three factors had been taken into account while choosing the 33 hospitals: these had the largest chunk of ICU beds (a total of 2,217), they were popular among residents, and were better equipped to segregate Covid and non-Covid patients as well as to increase the number of ICU beds if required.

Appearing for the Association of Healthcare Providers (India) (AHP), which challenged the Delhi government order, senior advocate Maninder Singh and advocate Sanjay Khetarpal said the 33 private hospitals already reserved 67% of their ICU beds for Covid patients.

Girdhar Gyani, director general of AHP, said reserving beds creates problem for specialised treatment. "The problem is that there are some specialised treatments — like transplants and complex surgeries — that do not happen in hospitals other than these 33. Now, it is a fact that more ICU beds are needed and the government could have reserved the same number of ICU beds in 60 other hospitals easily. Treatment for Covid-19 is not that complicated. Now, with these hospitals being forced to reserve beds for patients who need a liver or kidney transplant might have to travel outside Delhi to avail it," he said.

Gyani hit out at the government, saying there are beds vacant in many government hospitals "because nobody wants to go there". "The government should be punished for that. Instead, the private players are being punished," he said.

Delhi government representatives did not respond to requests for a comment.

The court was also critical of some other aspects of the government's preparations. "Have you set up helpdesks outside the hospitals? You say that you are running an ambulance facility but how many patients, who are Covid-19 infected, and cannot travel in the public transport, have been ferried and sent to the Radha Soami Beas Sector facility," the court asked, referring to one of the city's largest Covid treatment centres.

After hearing the government's submissions, the court said "no citizen with a health emergency should be made to run from pillar to post if there is

a bed available in a hospital".

Before Thursday's lifting of stay, the matter of reserving beds for Covid-19 patients reached the Supreme Court On Tuesday, the top court, while refusing to interfere with the Delhi high court's order, asked the government to again approach the Delhi high court.

At the time, ASG Jain had said: "If possible, please understand my predicament. The city is facing an extraordinary situation. Lots of people from other states are coming into Delhi for better health care. A large number of people in the middle class segment in the city prefer to get admitted in private hospitals."

To this, the top court judges said: "We are aware that the situation in city is worsening. Delhi has a problem, sometimes 5,000, sometimes 10,000, this is a fluctuating situation. You can bring this matter to the attention of the high court."

"If the hospitals are overwhelmed and the beds get tight, the government's morality of the disease will go up. People who are in need of ICU care or oxygen support need it in a hospital. If the government is at Covid-19 cases, most people are preferring to stay in home isolation. These days people also have the oxygen saturation monitors at home. The doctors are those who reach the hospitals are in need of immediate medical attention. If they do not get it, they are likely to die," said Dr Shobha Broy, former head of the department of virology at AIIMS.

Yadav, 31, said the coalition lost 20 seats because of alleged lapses and said he did not accept defeat as the "people's mandate" was in favour of the GA. "I will soon launch a thanksgiving campaign across for the big support people gave us," he said. Yadav said the difference in vote share between the NDA and GA was 0.1% and demanded a recount, especially of postal ballots.

"It was undoubtedly a mandate for change. The NDA used dhan (money), bal (power) and chhal (deceit) to win polls. We could have got 130 seats had there been no electoral malpractices," he said.

He also urged Kumar to step down. "Nitish ji should stop plotting if he has some morals left. He must respect people's decision & step down from his position," Yadav said, after names have been chosen the leader of the GA.

At his press conference later in the day, Kumar refused to respond to this jibe. "What do I have to say in such matters," he replied dismissively.

Kumar said the fixed procedure of government formation was to be followed. "The existing house is still November 29 and before swearing-in of the new government, the house has to be dissolved and a leader of ruling alliance has to be elected," he said.

A senior BJP official said they had not received any communication about the oath ceremony. On Thursday, the chief electoral officer (CEO) handed over the list of elected candidates to the governor. A senior JD (U) leader said the party for the ceremony may depend on availability of senior BJP leaders, including Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Kumar denied that there was any pressure from any quarter on him.

There will be no problem in running the government, I have always been uncompromising on the three Cs: crime, corruption and communalism. There is going to be no change. Not a single riot has taken place since I took over," he said.

He added that his party was analysing what went wrong on some seats and how votes got divided. "Some people succeeded in creating confusion but I do not have any doubts on any allies. The JD(U) suffered from more seats than the BJP due to this confusion," said Kumar.

A senior leader of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), which largely put up candidates against JD(U), but continues to remain in NDA, said that Kumar put the ball in the BJP's court. "It's for BJP to decide whether or not LJP should be retained in NDA," he said.

MHA think tank issues guidelines on arrests

NEW DELHI: The Bureau of Police Research and Development (BPRD), a think-tank under the Union Ministry of Home Affairs, has asked police departments across the country not to make arrests as a reprisal act or for the sake of routine issues.

The bureau has suggested that a person should be first served a notice of appearance and only when he/she fails to comply with it, then police should go ahead with the arrest.

The think-tank had last week issued elaborate "guidelines or draft Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for safeguarding persons to be arrested or detained by police authorities against custodial violence" to all police departments.

The guidelines strictly advise police authorities to follow the procedure while making arrests, or while dealing with people in their custody. It has said that the local witnesses should be asked a sense of security among the public and regarding the diminishing faith and confidence of the public in police. "Police officials have been advised against torturing a person in custody or compelling a person to give testimony or evidence that may incriminate him or her or testify against any person."

"Do not subject any person in

custody to torture, beating or cruel treatment. Ensure not to detain anyone for a prolonged period in the name of interrogation in this may amount to wrong confinement and illegal detention," the guidelines, reviewed by HT, have said.

The guidelines assume significance in the wake of torture of a father and his son — P Jayaraj (51) and J Bennicks (31) — in police custody in Tamil Nadu (TN) in June. The incident had occurred under the jurisdiction of Sathankulam police station in TN's Thoothukudi district.

Jayaraj had died on June 22 and Bennicks the following day. Police has been directed that when they are going to make any arrest, they must wear visible name tags and their names should also be recorded in a police diary.

An arrest memo of the arrested must be prepared, mentioning date, time and place of arrest. The memo must be signed by at least one reputed local witness and countersigned by the arrestee. For women, the SOPs state that police cannot arrest any woman after the sunset and before the sunrise unless under exceptional circumstances. "No police agency, without the constructive support of the society, can ever successfully implement its objective of crime control, maintenance of order," BPRD says

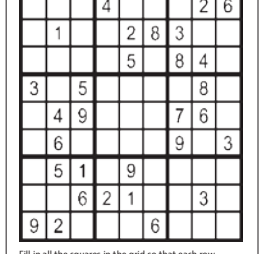
