- The above financial results have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on 11th August 2025 and subject to limited review by the Statutory Auditor of the Company.
- The results have been prepared in accordance with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 (Ind AS) prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and other recognised accounting practices and policies to the extent applicable.
- The Company has successfully implemented the SLBC restructuring package as per RBI master Directions on natural calamities. However, The South Indian Bank, one of the consortium lenders holding 7%, and one NBFC to whom Rs.6.50 Cr is outstanding as on date have dissented from the restructuring scheme. Company has preferred a writ petitions before Hon'ble High court of Madras which has given injunction orders against taking any coercive action.
- The Company has proposed to issue of warrants convertible into equity shares through preferential issue pursuant to Chapter V of SEBI (Issue of Capital and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2018 subject to approval at the forth coming AGM and subject to approvals by authorities
- The Company has also proposed to issue of 6% Non-convertible Cumulative Redeemable Preference Shares through private placement under the Companies Act, 2013 subject to approval at the forth coming AGM and subject to approvals by authorities.
- The Company has total Trade Creditors of Rs.8027 Lakh as on 30.06.2025. Some of these trade creditors have issued notices for recovery of their outstanding dues as on 30.06.2025 amounting to Rs. 2125 lakh. The Company is negotiating with such creditors for amicable settlements and some settlements have already made. One of the creditors who had approached the NCLT was settled amicably and accordingly IRP has filed withdrawal petition under section 12A. The Company sought time to submit schedule of payment to be made to pending creditors who have approached NCLT.
- The figures for the previous periods have been re-grouped /re-arranged wherever necessary to make them comparable with those of current period.

BAN ON OVERAGED VEHICLES

No coercive steps to be taken while SC hears review plea

IN A relief to vehicle owners in the National Capital Region (NCR), the Supreme Court on Tuesday directed that no coercive action be taken against owners of 10-year-old diesel and 15-year-old petrol vehicles while it hears a review plea filed by the Delhi government in this regard.

Issuing notice on the plea, a three-judge bench presided by Chief Justice of India B R Gavai said, "In the meantime, no coercive steps to be taken against the owners of the car on the ground that they are 10 years old in respect to diesel vehicles and 15 years old with respect to petrol vehicles." The bench also comprised Justices K Vinod Chandran and N V Anjaria.

As part of efforts to combat air pollution, the National Green Tribunal had in 2015 directed that diesel vehicles older than 10 years and petrol vehicles older than 15 years should not be allowed to operate in Delhi NCR. This was upheld by the Supreme Court in 2018.

Recently, the Delhi government had approached the Supreme Court seeking a review of the order saying the blanket ban on old vehicles "was observed to have caused numerous practical hardships to the citizens of Delhi".

In its application dated July 25, the Rekha Gupta government had argued that "the road-worthiness of a vehicle is a technical and sci-

entific issue that must be linked to actual emissions as tested and recorded by mechanisms as set out under the Motor Vehicles Act, the Central Motor Vehicles Rules, etc., as opposed to blanket ban on the basis of age which is unlinked to actual emissions".

It added that the ban on the plying of the said vehicles in the last seven years, "though undoubtedly salutary in aim, was observed to have caused numerous practical hardships to the citizens of Delhi, which today, in light of the advancements in technology and enforcement now prima facie appear to outweigh the prudence and feasibility of continuance of the said ban".

The plea further urged the court to direct the Centre or the Commission on Air Quality Management (CAQM) "to carry out a suitable broad based, scientific study on the need for continuance" of the complete ban imposed by the Supreme Court's October 29, 2018, order.

The government said the complete ban order "was originally passed as an emergency

measure during a period when Bharat Stage IV (BS-IV) emission standards were in force and the migration to Bharat Stage VI (BS-VI), which has much stricter and advanced norms, had not yet commenced".

It added, "However, it is submitted that to tackle the issue of pollution in the NCR region, a comprehensive policy is required which gives vehicle fitness based on the actual emission levels of an individual vehicle as per scientific methods rather than implementing a blanket ban based on solely the age of the vehicle."

The government said that significant technological, legal, and environmental developments have taken place since 2018, which warrant a "re-examination of this decision" by an expert body to form a structured and graded plan to tackle pollution.

The state said that since the issue of Delhi's air quality is not confined solely to the National Capital Territory but rather to the broader NCR, it is submitted that "it would be appropriate if suitable scientific studies on the feasibility, desirability and efficacy of continuing the said ban are carried out" at the level of the Union government or the CAQM.

The Delhi government's attempt to stop fuel supply to end-of-life vehicles had met with hurdles soon after it came into effect in the Capital on July 1. Citing "critical operational and infrastructural challenges", it had asked CAQM to put the fuel ban "on hold with immediate effect."

UG ADMISSIONS Over 9,000 seats remain vacant across DU colleges

WITH JUST a week left for Delhi University (DU) to wrap its undergraduate admissions for the year, more than 9,000 seats are yet to be occupied across its colleges.

Speaking to *The Indian Express*, Haneet Gandhi, Dean of Admissions said the seat vacancies are owing to students not filling their preferences strategically in the initial allocation rounds.

"For instance, students with low scores opted for a course in a top college but were allocated a seat in a course or college they did not prefer," Gandhi explained.

"Some filled their preferences without a clear awareness of the cut-offs. Along with this, cases of rejections due to improper documents have also been taken into account. This has wasted about 5,000 allocations in the previous round. These students have, however, applied again in the mid-entry window for their choice of college."

She added that off-campus colleges also have vacant seats. Colleges like Aditi Mahavidyalaya and Bhagini Nivedita see hundreds of vacant seats every year.

DU will release its third allocation list on August 13, followed by the first lists for extracurricular activities, sports, and Children of War (CW) quotas on August 15. August 19 is the final date for closing the UG admission process.

CBI arrests two senior CPWD engineers for taking bribe

FIVE PERSONS, including two senior engineers of the Central Public Works Department (CPWD), were arrested by the CBI on Monday for allegedly taking bribes to clear pending bills of a private contractor involved in executing works at Chanakyapuri in Delhi.

Four more engineers, who have been booked, are being questioned, the central agency said.

The CBI identified the arrested persons as Jai Prakash, executive engineer (Civil); Prabhakar Chaurasiya, assistant engineer (Civil); as well as Shubham Goel, and his father Rajesh Goel, the owner of Shubham Electricals.

"The CBI registered a case on August 11 against 12 persons, in-

cluding the four arrested accused. The agency had received information that Shubham would be paying a bribe of Rs 6 lakh to Jai Prakash on August 11. Accordingly, a trap was laid and both were caught along with money," a CBI spokesperson said, adding that CPWD has awarded multiple contracts to Shubham Electricals.

The agency said that searches were conducted at 10 places during which Rs 55 lakh in cash was recovered.

The CBI alleged in the FIR that on August 1, it received a tip-off stating that Shubham has informed his father that CPWD has sought a payment of Rs 1.52 crore against some of the company's pending bills. He also allegedly asked Rajesh on how much bribe money is to be given to various CPWD officers.

"His father directed that 3%

of total bill is to be given to the executive engineer, 2% to the assistant engineer and the junior engineer, 1% to the CPWD accounts section, 1% to computer operators and clerks, and rest 1-2% to the superintending engineer for the award of the tender," the FIR stated.

It accused CPWD engineers of taking bribes from private contractors engaged in executing works in Chanakyapuri in lieu of extending undue favours in awarding contracts, allowing poor quality construction materials and clearing inflated bills, as well as causing wrongful loss to government exchequer.

Now, Delhi cops can depose in court from police stations via video call

DELHI POLICE officers can now provide evidence to court via video conference from police stations, officials said on Tuesday. This comes after Delhi L-G V K Saxena notified all police stations as designated places for deposition.

According to officials from the L-G Office, this marks a departure from the current requirement for officers — including investigating officers and those who are witnesses in criminal cases — to be physically present in court for providing evidence or deposition. Officers will no longer have to travel and physically attend court proceedings — saving a great amount of time and resources.

This major reform comes under the draft model rules (Nyaya Shruti) on video conferencing under the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, which recommends for inclusion of police stations as a "designated place" for deposition through video conference for police personnel/officers.

According to officials, Union Home Minister Amit Shah, who has personally been supervising the smooth implementation of the three criminal laws since their rollout last year, has also been emphasising on deposition of police personnel through video conferences from police stations.

In a recent review meeting, Shah had directed for setting up of an adequate number of video conferencing facilities to ensure proper coordination between police and the courts.

'Much-needed relief': Govt welcomes SC directive on end-of-life vehicles

AS THE Supreme Court on Tuesday granted interim relief to owners of end-of-life vehicles (ELVs), the state government welcomed the decision, stressing that the move could bring permanent relief to the residents of Delhi.

Commenting on the development, Chief Minister Rekha Gupta said, "By actively participating in the judicial process, we will continue to firmly represent the interests of the people of Delhi."

Environment Minister Manjinder Singh Sirsa also responded positively to the court's decision. He thanked the Supreme Court and Gupta for "securing much-needed relief for lakhs of vehicle owners in Delhi."

"This is a big relief for the people of Delhi... Chief Minister Rekha Gupta fought this battle on behalf of the people of Delhi. We hope that in the days to come, we will be able to bring permanent relief

to the residents of Delhi," the minister said.

In April this year, the Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) had directed a phased denial of fuel to ELVs at fuel stations in the NCR (National Capital Region) — in Delhi from July 1, in high-density NCR districts from November 1, and in the rest of the NCR from April 1, 2026.

The move was intended to force ELVs, a major source of vehicular pollution, off the roads.

2 arrested for gangrape of two minor girls

TWO MEN have been arrested from Outer North Delhi for allegedly sexually assaulting two minor girls on Saturday.

Police said the incident took place on August 7 when the two girls went swimming in a private pool, which is yet to be opened for the public. The accused, who were arrested on Saturday itself, are the contractor who is building the swimming pool and its caretaker, police added.

"On August 8, a woman came to the police station to report that her daughter and another girl had been sexually assaulted the previous day..." DCP (Outer North) Harehsvar Swami said.

He added that in their statements taken before the judicial magistrate first class under Section 183 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, the victims corroborated the complaint.

Police said the girls would often visit the pool. "On August 7, they reached the pool around 7-8 pm to swim. There, the two men allegedly lured them with food to their living quarters adjoining the pool and sexually assaulted them. They let the girls go the next day, threatening to kill them if they told anyone of what had happened," said an officer.

The accused have been booked under sections 70(2) (gangrape), 127(2) (wrongful confinement) and 351 (criminal intimidation) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, along with sections 6 (aggravated penetrative sexual assault) and 10 (aggravated sexual assault) of the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act.

"Pillow covers, a bedsheet, have been recovered from the room where the assault allegedly took place, along with a DVR. The evidence has been sent for forensic testing," the officer said.

Mumbai Cong leaders target Gaikwad, complain of ‘organisational stagnancy’

She terms it gossip: ‘Will focus on work instead... sure that party colleagues will join me in protests’

EVEN AS parties are preparing for the upcoming local body elections, a section of Mumbai Congress leaders are targeting city unit chief and Lok Sabha MP Varsha Gaikwad, alleging organisational stagnancy. However, the leaders who were to meet Ramesh Chennithala, AICC in-charge of state unit, in Pune on

Tuesday, postponed the meeting. “We are not against any individual. We want to convey to the All India Congress Committee that there is organisational stagnancy in the Mumbai unit. We are not taking up the civic issues aggressively as compared to Sena(UBT) and there is decline of the party’s presence from media as well,” said a senior Mumbai Congress leader who was to be in the delegation to meet Chennithala. Another leader said that the

Mumbai unit was lacking at organising cultural events that resonate with Mumbai and Maharashtra, especially the Marathi culture. “We have nothing against the Mumbai Congress chief. But we want the organisation to be more active,” he said. However, Gaikwad said that it was decided in the party leaders’ meeting in Delhi that she will remain the chief of Mumbai unit. “I prefer to ignore these reports, which are nothing but gossip. Instead, I choose to focus on my work that involves opposing issues such as Adani land grab in Mumbai and corruption in BMC. I am sure that all my colleagues in the party will join me in the protests,” she told *The Indian Express*. Gaikwad said that as a woman and a Dalit leader, she is focused on building the party in Mumbai. However, the groupism in the party ahead of the local body polls comes as a shock to many workers who feel that the party should re-

main united to take on BJP and its allies. There are others in the unit who feel that groupism has existed in the party for decades. “Every Mumbai Congress chief has faced this. Varsha Gaikwad has been vocal against Adani for months. It is expected that all Mumbai Congress leaders join her in protests in Dharavi, Mulund and Kurla. Mumbai Congress leaders putting up a united front will surely make a difference,” said a Mumbai Congress leader.

DENIES BAIL TO ALLEGED BANGLADESHI NATIONAL

Unverified IDs insufficient to prove Indian citizenship: HC

REJECTING THE bail plea of a Thane resident, an alleged Bangladeshi national who police claimed illegally entered India, the Bombay High Court Tuesday observed that his claim of being Indian citizen and identity documents be strictly examined under Citizenship Act. “The applicant has failed to produce any document duly verified or authenticated by the concerned government authorities that could conclusively establish his Indian citizenship,” a single-judge bench of Justice Amit Borkar observed in an order on bail application of Babu Abdul Ruf Sardar, who claimed that he had valid Indian identity proofs including Aadhaar card, Voter ID, PAN Card, and Passport.

“Merely relying on the existence of certain identity documents such as Aadhaar, PAN, or Voter ID, without verification of the process through which these were obtained, cannot be treated as sufficient proof of lawful citizenship at this stage, particularly when the very authenticity of such documents is under investigation,” the HC noted

“In such circumstances,” the Justice Borkar added, “where the investigation is at a crucial stage, and where serious allegations involving national security, illegal entry, and use of forged government documents are involved, the Court finds it neither proper nor prudent to enlarge the applicant on bail at this juncture.”

Wagle Estate Police station in Thane had last year arrested Sardar under provisions of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), Passport (Entry into India) Act, and Foreigners Order for entering India without valid passport or travel documents, deliberately suppressing foreign nationality by creating and using forged Indian identity documents such as Aadhaar, PAN and falsely showing himself as Indian citizen. The Police claimed that he not

only misrepresented his status before the authorities but also obtained an Aadhaar Card by submitting fabricated documents. Advocate Jyotiram S Yadav for the applicant denied prosecution’s claims and argued that his client was a bona fide citizen of India and there was no reliable or conclusive evidence produced by the prosecution to prove that he was Bangladeshi national. “Merely having documents such as Aadhaar card, Pan card or voter ID does not, by itself, make someone a citizen of India. These documents are meant for identification or availing services but they do not override the basic legal requirement of citizenship as prescribed in the Act,” the judge said.

Illegal betting app: ED conducts raids at 15 locations in several states

THE ENFORCEMENT Directorate (ED) in Mumbai on Tuesday carried out searches at around 15 locations in Mumbai, Delhi-NCR, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Madurai and Surat in connection with the case over the illegal betting app “parimatch”.

More than Rs 2,000 crore was allegedly duped from users

of the betting app. The investigation was initiated under Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) on the basis of an FIR registered by Cyber Police Station, Mumbai in 2024. As per ED officials, the preliminary investigation shows that the funds were collected from duped users in mule accounts. These funds, aggregating to sums more than Rs 2,000 crore, were layered through multiple payment aggregators and domestic money transfer agents.

This amount was then layered and sent through crypto wallets, cash withdrawals through ATMs in one locality of Tamil Nadu, low value UPI transfers, etc. The central agency’s investigative team has so far seized various documents, mobile phones, and computer peripherals. “Parimatch” is a Cyprus-based gaming and betting application that began operations on a large scale in India in 2021.
